TWO MOORS WAY 50TH ANNIVERSARY – 29 MAY 2026

Did you know that there's a 102-mile promoted walking route running right across Devon, which goes through the middle of Witheridge? Well, there is – and it's 50 years old this year!

The Two Moors Way (TMW) starts in Ivybridge on the southern edge of Dartmoor, and heads northeast, via Holne and Hamel Down, before passing near Chagford and through Drewsteignton. Devon's rural heartland comes next – Morchard Bishop, Witheridge and Knowstone – followed by Tarr Steps, Withypool and Simonsbath. A crossing of Exmoor's highest ground leads to a dramatic finish above the East Lyn valley before a steep descent to the coast at Lynmouth.

And in 2005 the TMW was officially linked with a section of the Erme–Plym Trail to form Devon's Coast to Coast walk, a 117-mile route between Wembury on the south coast, and Lynmouth on the north.

To mark the 50th anniversary the Two Moors Way Association is holding a series of circular guided walks (8–12 miles) along the route:

Saturday 28 March Lynmouth

Saturday 11 April Simonsbath

Saturday 25 April Holne

Saturday 16 May Withypool

Friday 29 May **50th Anniversary Event** Two linear walks (c. 7 miles) from Witheridge and Whelmstone Cross, meeting in Morchard Bishop for a celebratory tea, with speaker

Saturday 30 May Drewsteignton

Saturday 6 June Ivybridge

Witheridge Garden Club October Meeting 2025

Tony Lindsell and Malcolm Crook from the Tiverton Bee Keepers came to talk to us about Bee Keeping. Tiverton is a branch of the Devon Bee Keepers Association. Between the two of them, they have 80 hives. Malcolm is the Apiary Manager and Tony the Chairman.

The branch was fortunate to be offered a site for its apiary by the National Trust at [Knightshayes](#). Since 2014 this site has been run as a training apiary, providing beginners and improvers with the opportunity to handle bees. In years when honey is harvested from the apiary it is sold on the branch stand at local country fayres and shows.

We learnt about the early days of bee keeping when Skeps were used instead of hives, and then transitioned to the wooden hives we know today. In Great Britain, there are 52,789 beekeepers, 96 of these being bee farmers who each have more than 150 colonies of bees. Between the 1st and 2nd World Wars, a lot of the bee colonies died out.

Disease weakens the colony – in particular the Varroa mite, which are external parasites that feed on honeybees. These reddish-brown mites attach to adult bees and their developing brood, feeding on their fat bodies and spreading harmful viruses. They are oval-shaped, roughly 1-2 mm in size, and visible to the naked eye. Varroa mites reproduce within the brood cells of honeybees. Female mites enter the cells just before they are capped and lay eggs on the developing bee larvae. The offspring feed on the larvae and mature into adults before emerging with the newly hatched bee. This life cycle allows mites to multiply rapidly, particularly during periods of brood production.

Dusting bees with icing sugar may sound bizarre, but the bees clean themselves and in doing so get rid of the mites.

Asian Hornets are a major threat to our honey bees, and the use of The Asian Hornet Watch App is a useful tool to report sightings to the National Bee Unit. You can also report them to local bee keepers.

Single flowers are better for pollinators as they can easily collect nectar. Dandelions and brambles are favourites with honey bees.

The Queen Bee flies away from the hive, and drones (male Bees) mate with her. On her return, she can lay up to 2,000 eggs a day, the unfertilised eggs become drones.

We were shown some flowers which had been dipped in Beeswax – a process developed by the Victorians – and which allowed the flowers to keep their shape and colour surprisingly well.

A very interesting and informative evening.

WITHERIDGE ASTRONOMICAL SOCIETY

A new year and hopefully some clear skies to observe the stars and planets. Things do not change much overhead, or do they? All stars do move at a range of speeds. The fastest ones, near the centre of galaxies move at 621 miles per second. Here on Earth we are hurtling through space at between 124 and 155 miles per second. Over time, thousands of years, this movement of stars can be seen as the shape of constellations changes subtly.

Looking to the southern sky the Orion Constellation is highly distinctive and is with us for some months. The line of stars forming the belt are quite recognisable. Just below is the vertical line of three 'stars' forming the 'sword'. With good viewing the central star appears as a hazy spot. This is the Orion Nebula, a star forming region where stars are being formed from huge clouds of gas and dust to begin their journey through space. Using binoculars the nebula is an amazing sight, well worth going outside to view. The nebula is illuminated by the four stars that form the Trapezium cluster.

In the Spring months our galaxy, the Milky Way can be seen as a band of stars stretching from low on the northern horizon, passing overhead to the southern horizon. To the naked eye it looks like a milky white belt in the sky. But, with binoculars or a telescope, wow! The eye is met by countless stars all shining brightly. Of all sizes and colours to us they may seem as just points of mainly white light, but when we associate each star to its constellation, and then look up its details, we then learn that star's characteristics, its colour, size and type. No longer just a point of light it now has a name and quite probably some special characteristics appertaining to it.

February brings two bright planets into the night sky. At mag. -3.9 Venus shines brightly all night. If you can find a dark space you may be lucky to see your shadow cast on the ground by the reflected light from Venus. The other bright planet is Jupiter at mag. -2.6. At the end of the month it may be found just south of the Moon. Saturn, at mag 1.0 can be seen for a few hours after sunset.

March brings the start of Summer Time & Spring. The clocks go forward an hour on the 29th March. In the skies we see the familiar 'W' of Cassiopeia, always good to reacquaint oneself with an easily recognised constellation. The red planet Mars shining at mag. 1.2 is visible for most of the month and

April and the brighter parts of the Milky Way become visible running parallel to the horizon. There is an interesting pairing of planets on the 19th April with Mars at mag. 1.2 just 1.2° north of Saturn mag. 0.8.

We have a meteor shower to look forward to peaking on the 22nd April. The best time to see the meteors will be in the early hours of the morning after the Moon has set. Should you miss this shower there will be another shower opportunity in May peaking on the 6th, the η-Aquariids. As the Earth rotates the leading edge of our planet occurs after midnight, this being the best time to observe any meteors.

Early Notice - On August 12th we shall experience a partial Solar Eclipse at tea-time. Classed as partial we shall see about 98% of the Sun covered by the Moon and so expect there to be significant darkening. More details in the next issue but make a note of the date now.

The Witheridge Astronomical Society meets monthly at 7.30pm on the third Thursday in the Committee Room of Witheridge Parish Hall. We are not a 'highbrow' society, our aim being to introduce people to the hobby/ science/ wonders of the night sky. If you have an interest do come along and join us. No experience or knowledge is needed. We have kindly been given some telescopes which are available to borrow.

Witheridge Allotment Society

As I write this we have snow and the ground is frozen! However as we start to see the days lengthen we turn our attention once again to growing our own fruit and vegetables and planning what we will grow.

Growing your own potatoes is one of the most rewarding vegetables to grow, but to grow them successfully you'll need good quality seed potatoes rather than seeds produced by the flowers. There are many different varieties so you can grow your own throughout the summer seasons. The first earlies which are ready June onwards for harvesting, are particularly popular as are December-ready varieties that are planted in July, but no matter what type you prefer they're all grown in roughly the same way.



There are two ways to grow your seed potatoes.

- Dig over a patch of ground and remove all the stone and roots, if you add some well-rotted manure this will give your seed potatoes a boost. Dig to a depth of ten centimetres and place one potato in with the chit facing up and plant them at least twelve inches apart. As the greenery grows keep covering them entirely, this is called 'earthing up'. You'll create a mound of earth like a mole hill which keeps growth safe from frosts.

You can also grow all types of seed potatoes in a bag or container. This method means you can use compost which is stone-free and simply upturn the pot at harvest time. Plant them as above and keep well-watered.

So even if you only have a patio you can still grow a few and who doesn't like that taste of a new potato!

Shop around as many garden centres, agricultural stores or discount stores stock them. A top quality seed potato will look firm and feel springy rather than soft and soggy.

If you would like to give an allotment a try this year please get in touch as we have two plots available.

It's very rewarding and cheaper than a gym membership!

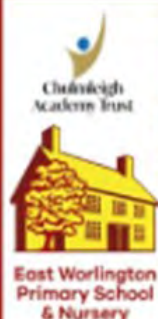

District Councillor Update – January 2026

I hope you had a happy and relaxing Christmas and enjoyed time with your friends and family. I would like to wish you all a very Happy New Year.

I also want to say a big thank you to everyone who helps make our community such a special place to live. In particular, I would like to thank the chairs and councillors of our parish councils. A small group of people do a huge amount of work for the community, often behind the scenes and without much gratitude. Your work really does make a difference.

Below is my latest update as your District Councillor.

Trade Waste Collections for Businesses

Despite my efforts to highlight the impact on local businesses, a decision has been made to end trade waste collections for businesses. I am continuing to explore what can be done to minimise the impact, so please do contact me if you are likely to be affected.

Local Government Reform in Devon – Update

The Government is considering replacing Devon's current two-tier system with unitary councils, where one authority would provide all local services.

One proposal, put forward by most councils, including North Devon, would create three unitary authorities. The first would cover the west, south, and Torbay area, including West Devon, Teignbridge, South Hams, and Torbay. The second would cover the east, north, and mid-Devon area, including East Devon, Exeter City, Mid Devon, North Devon, and Torridge. Plymouth City Council would remain a standalone unitary authority.

Another proposal suggests four unitary authorities, with expanded city councils for Plymouth, Exeter, and Torbay each forming separate authorities alongside a fourth authority covering the remaining rural and coastal districts.

Supporters say this could simplify decision-making and reduce duplication. I fear it could weaken local voice and identity, and the savings are not certain.

A decision is expected in mid-2026, with elections in May 2027 and the new councils starting in April 2028. Current District Councillors would likely remain in post until then.

Affordable and Social Housing at Benson Grange

The final affordable and social rent homes at Benson Grange are now being released over the coming weeks. Allison Homes expect to complete work on the site by March, and possibly earlier.

I am pleased that the way homes were allocated was changed to prioritise people with a local connection. This has benefited many local families, and homes are still being offered to those with a local connection.

Shared ownership homes are now also available. These offer another way for local residents to afford a home and get onto the property ladder.

I am also very pleased that Allison Homes and L&G honoured their agreement with the community. Over £30,000 was provided for community projects in addition to the £400,678 of Section 106 funding, which has now been fully paid. We are already seeing the benefits of this investment in the community.

Old Allotment Land next to the Park at Willow Rise

I have been exploring whether the land next to the new park at Willow Rise could be rented or purchased from the District Council for community use. This appears to be possible, and I am currently reviewing the full details so the Parish Council can consider the options and decide how to move forward.

One suggested use has been a community orchard, but the Parish Council would welcome other ideas and suggestions from residents.

Section 106 Community Projects

Additional funding has been agreed for the Parish Hall. An extra £8,000 was used to improve drainage and guttering, completing the insulation and cladding work. This work is now complete and the hall is ready to serve the community for many years to come.

Other projects funded by the Section 106 community fund are currently being worked on. These include improvements to the sports field facilities, plans for a new state-of-the-art skatepark, and the refurbishment and enhancement of the pump track. The pump track project is being supported by Allison Homes and is expected to start soon. Further updates will be shared as these projects develop.

Potholes and Blocked Drains

The wet and cold weather is causing serious damage to our roads. Please report potholes and blocked drains on the Devon County Council website.
