WITHERIDGE PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

I believe that the past year will go down in our annuls of history as the year of planning application 73742. We all engaged in lots of extra council, site, and officer meetings to put forward the residents' concerns as to the capacity of the physical and social infrastructure, transport and the local road network and traffic calming. To have all our concerns dismissed by the case officer at the full planning meeting in one sentence "that the infrastructure capacity was the responsibility of the provider" was dismissive to say the least. The new chief planning officer welcomed it as a contribution to the five year housing land supply of Torridge and North Devon. Rather irrational statement as it was the fault of Torridge, not identifying enough land for housing that caused this application to come forward, allowing developers to ignore the local plan.

We encountered the county highway's 'deaf ear' and were given the brush off concerning your traffic calming worries. Our suggestions were a village gateway at the entrance to Chapner Farm like the one at Meshaw, rumble strips, contrasting tarmac colour, interactive speed sign and 30mph roundels. All D.C.C. are prepared to do for the £6,000 section 106 (Developer's contributions to the Council) money is to move the 30mph sign a little further down the road to the village sign as all the other standard traffic calming measures would involve the county in maintenance costs. I sincerely hope that no one in our village has cause to question this decision. The money allocated for the school Zebra crossing has finally come to fruition, albeit some two years late, and the bus stop at the school has been moved a little further along with a new one constructed adjacent to Butts Close.

The refurbishment of the new playground is progressing at a pace, but the recent wet weather has delayed the laying of the safer surfacing. Many thanks to councillors Searles and Dorow for drawing up the schedule of works, JCT contract and the tender document. The new green space which abuts the playground and Willow Rise will become the Parish responsibility when legal documents being drawn up between Alison Homes and the Parish Council are agreed and signed and land searches have taken place. The Parish council have also agreed with the developers that the existing sales office area will be leased back to them for an annual sum of £2,000 for five years. This will go some way to fund our plan to enclose the site with bow topped railings like the existing fronting the B3137. The Parish council with the approval of the Parish Hall committee have mopped up the remaining s106 money from the Willow Rise development allocated for play space, to encase the tots' playground with bow topped railings, as the existing fencing has reached end of life. In addition to the railings being playground compliant, the new pedestrian gate will be wheelchair access friendly. This will enhance the area aesthetically and keep our children safe. This application was ratified by the District's strategy and resources committee on the 6^{th of} March and Witheridge was awarded £17,000 towards the project. Many thanks to Peter our clerk for drawing up the documents.

The District Council, together with the Parish now must decide which community and social infrastructure projects to put forward for the s106 money, so called "heads of terms" that will come from the developers of the new 155 houses. Although the District were aware that projects had to go forward as early as last December, the Parish were not aware or consulted until the March meeting. We therefore held an extra meeting on the 13th March to discuss these. I was delighted that 14 members of the public attended to put forward their comments - nothing worse than apathy. It was agreed that the following projects go forward:

- * Construction of an all-weather/MUGA (Multi Use Games Area) on land currently available within the village.
- * Land acquisition for sports pitches/open space in village
- * Improvement of facilities at the Adventure playground
- * Extension of the cemetery
- * Additional car parking close to the square
- * Improvement of the facilities at the Parish Hall and grounds.

At the last two council meetings we have heard concerns from residents of both Cannington Road and Drayford Lane as to the lack of hedge, tree, and fence maintenance at the Cannington Road open green space. The Parish council achieved partial success via the North Devon enforcement officer and the grass is now being cut, but with the lack of enforcement officers, where do we go next?

I end by saying a big thank you to the "Knights of Witheridge" for the amazing vibrant display of daffodils you have planted throughout the village. They certainly are 'A host of golden daffodils' and lift the spirits even on the gloomiest of days.

WITHERIDGE GARDENING CLUB

At this year's first meeting in February, Jonty Barlow from UK Biogas came to talk to us about Anaerobic Digestion, which is the process of extracting biogas from breaking down organic waste which can then be converted into electricity, injected into the national gas grid or used for fuelling road transport.

It's a great way of generating sustainable renewable energy 24/7, as we humans are never short on waste!

The Anaerobic Digester in Nomansland collects biogas from a mixture of crops, farmyard manure and chicken litter and converts it into electricity to supply the farm and the national electricity grid. Nomansland Biogas is currently investing in state-of-the-art technology to improve the biogas yield without increasing feedstock volume and most importantly allow the digester to be fed with predominantly local farm wastes.

The mixture generates a warm 40 degrees inside the digester, allowing bacteria to thrive in the absence of oxygen and speed up the decomposition process. Once the gas has been released the digestate (or biodigestate) is removed from the chamber and can then be used as a fertiliser or soil conditioner creating a circular sustainable process.

The biodigestate has a remarkable effect on any degraded soils that it's applied to due to its rich range of macro and micronutrients. Its fibrous qualities promote air pockets for oxygenating the soil and has impressive water retentive properties.

They plan on making the biodigestate available to the horticultural market. Stay tuned to the Witheridge Garden Club for updates!

In March, Ros Nichols from RoseTime Flowers in Tiverton took us on a photographic tour of some lovely gardens in and around this area. The photos were accompanied by music, and we were treated to some fantastic photos starting at Ashley Court and Backswood, both near Tiverton, then further afield to Coppet Hill, Bridport, Highgrove and Tetbury – unfortunately no photography allowed in Highgrove Garden. Next, the Dart Farm Sculpture Trail & Garden Park, behind Trago Mills – not many people knew about this one.

Next, onto Holbrook Garden (some might know this as Sampford Peverell Shrubs), Holcombe Court which is open once a year to support the Hospice, and a surprising tour of St. Peter's Church Roof, with some great views over Tiverton. This roof is open once a year for a Heritage tour. We ended with RHS Rosemoor with its winter lighting show.

Many Methodist churches try to follow his teaching in whatever way they can.

The Church here at Witheridge has a relatively small congregation but we try to find ways to help people in our local community. For over 10 years up until Covid, the Churches Together ran a community lunch each month at the Parish Hall. After Covid restrictions were lifted, the volunteers felt they could no longer continue, so a small group of volunteers at the Methodist Church took on this task.

The size of the church limits numbers to around 26 people, rather than the 40 that met at the Parish Hall. These lunches are held on the first Wednesday of the month only and are nearly always fully booked.

Our once a month Saturday coffee mornings provide somewhere else for people from the village, and surrounding area, to meet and have a good chat.

Again, we see around 20 to 25 people, many from the churches but other members of the community also come along.

Thanks to the generosity of our regular customers, we have raised some money for church funds and also gave a donation of £100 to the Air Ambulance.

Due to the King's Coronation, we will not be having a coffee morning in May as we will be helping to organise a free event at the Parish Hall.



ALLOTMENT SOCIETY

Well what a wet time we've had of it; hopefully we shall see spring in full bloom.

Let's hope that all the rain is behind us and we can concentrate on sowing the crops for this year.

Sow seed outdoors for beetroot, carrots, Swiss chard, summer cauliflower, lettuce, leeks, radish, turnip, spring and pickling onions, peas including early crop main crop, mange tout, sugar snaps and perpetual spinach in well-prepared soil.

We can also start to plant broad beans, coriander, parsnips.

After the winter months our plots will need weeding and turning.

To make the most of the space we have, there are friends and foes within the gardening world—here are a few items that should not be planted together.

FOES

Beans and Onions, Tomatoes and Corn, Potatoes and Sunflowers, Cucumbers and Rosemary, Parsnips and Carrots

FRIENDS

Beetroot go well with Brussel sprouts, Broccoli, Onions, Swiss Chard and Cabbages

Peas like Beans, Carrots, Turnips, Cucumber, Radishes and Corn Parsnips like Onions, Lettuce and Radishes.

WITHERIDGE ASTRONOMICAL SOCIETY

Witheridge Astronomical Society meets at 7.30pm on the third Thursday of the month in Witheridge Parish Hall Committee Room with a charge of just £3 per session. Everyone is welcome, regardless of age or knowledge, to join in and share in the observing sessions (after the main meeting). We have two telescopes that have been kindly given to the Society and Members may borrow these at any time to enhance their own viewing from home. They are astronomical telescopes of modest size, ideal for getting used to using, before thinking of buying your own.

In February members from the Society went to Exmoor, known for its lack of light pollution, to spend an evening observing the night sky. Braving the cold, we were lucky to have mainly clear sky. The evening's highlight was the conjunction (alignment in a straight line) of the Moon, Jupiter and Venus. All three shone brightly against a dark sky just after sunset. Venus being more than half lighted, but less than full. Jupiter's four Galilean moons were visible and on the planet itself two of the 'surface' bands could be observed. The Moon, was majestic with its display of craters of all sizes.

We moved into spring on the 20th March and on 26th March we put our clocks forward by one hour for the move to British Summer Time. However, UT or GMT (Greenwich Mean Time) is still the time used in astronomy no matter when in the year.

Looking at targets for this spring let us begin with Arcturus. This is a red giant and the brightest star in the constellation of Boötes (the Herdsman). It can be found by following the curve of the tail of Ursa Major (the Great Bear). It is the fourth brightest star in the Northern Hemisphere and was, in 1635, the first star to be observed with a telescope in daylight.

In 1933 the light from Arcturus was focussed by telescope onto several photoelectric cells the current so obtained was used to switch on the floodlights at the Chicago World's Fair. Arcturus shoots through space at nearly 90 miles per second. As seen from earth we see the star moving across the sky at a rate of 3.9 arcminutes per century.

Now for a challenge, but be careful! See if you can see the planet Venus, in daylight. Try looking due south and at an altitude of 63° at 14.45 UT on the 2nd May. Make sure that you do not try viewing anywhere near the Sun using any kind of instrument – you will be blinded permanently. If we are lucky and have no clouds then Venus may well be bright enough to see in broad daylight, it is a matter of knowing where to look. On dark nights with no Moon shadows can be cast by the light from Venus.

With the month of June we welcome the summer solstice (June 21) and it will maintain a form of twilight all night long – not best for observing. Even old favourites such as the Plough will be difficult to see, except just after midnight. If we are lucky we may see some noctilucent clouds. Distinctive clouds shining with an electric-blue tint. Looking towards the North Pole they are the highest clouds occurring at altitudes of 80-85 km, much higher than other clouds. Visible on summer nights, around the solstice, they are illuminated by sunlight reaching them from the Sun which is hidden below the horizon, and the clouds rising above the horizon within an expanding cone shape.

If these events interest you and you wish to learn more, come along and join the Society.

People4ponies!

Rain....More rain...And....Mud - that summarises the run up to April and in many ways it's more than just the weather that has been challenging!

In February my friend and super P4P volunteer Margaret Hunston (who lived in Witheridge for over 30 years) left Witheridge at short notice to be admitted to a nursing home in Derbyshire. She had been a massive part of People4ponies since 2007 as many of you will know - especially the fundraising side with tombolas and her infamous marmalade and blackcurrant jam. We miss her very much.

The day before Margaret left for Derbyshire, I lost my beautiful Romanian shepherd dog Alf, whom many of you knew from our adventures in Witheridge. He had many admirers within the P4P community. At 14 years old he'd already outlived his life expectancy. With the loss of Alf and Margaret it felt like losing my whole family, which was an incredibly sad time.

We were also sad to learn of the death of Terry Pincombe who was such a key figure in both the local farming community and the lives of our ponies. He will be missed by so many people! He was a very kind and generous person and our ponies owe their lives to him and his decisions to stand by them.

Terry lost all his cows and sheep in the foot and mouth disease saga of 2001 and through the advice of a friend ended up buying a group of wild ponies which was the only way he could keep his grass down...Little did he know that he was actually saving the lives of these ponies (one of them was already registered as dead it turned out!)

He was really making a huge commitment with not just the original ponies but also their offspring. They were totally traumatised after being manhandled and mutilated. Terry would need help as there would end up being 51 of them.

Terry really wanted to do the right thing by the ponies and was determined that they wouldn't be sent to slaughter, refusing to do this and also when a big national rescue advised this and gave the number for the slaughterhouse...and then again when the dealers turned up and offered to take them away. P4P ended up being formed and he worked with Paul and Cilla the whole way along - allowing them to have use of different fields for the boys and girls so they could be separated as soon as possible. Terry let the ponies graze with the cows and sheep and so they could be worked on a few at a time and let them be there for as long as was needed.


