

Witheridge Garden Club

At our July meeting, Carol and John Northam came to talk to us about Witheridge in Bloom - WIB for short. Several of our members are volunteers for WIB, and it was interesting to hear about its origins.

Some years ago, the Parish Council wanted to enhance our lovely village, and Chris Kershaw undertook to start things going. Chris was also a member of the Garden Club and an avid gardener.

After Chris retired, Carol took over and introduced new planters throughout the village. Carol was keen to get volunteers to help out with the mammoth task and WIB started to grow. One idea was to do something on the Triangle at the top of the village. Carol discovered that it was privately owned and after some time managed to locate the owner, who willingly gave permission for it to be looked after by WIB. The tractor tyres were provided by Kit James, also a member of the Garden Club, and WIB volunteers got to work.

Carol then obtained permission from North Devon Homes and North Devon Council to place planters at Merryside Villas and Butts Close. Chapple Corner was a bit of a mess, and Donald Harris with his tractor and scoop made several trips to clear the rubbish.

Allison Homes gave permission, and provided the funding for 2 planters on the new development of Willow Rise and Juniper Way.

John then told us how WIB is financed. At the beginning, the Parish Council funded the insurance and some of the planting. The Knights of Witheridge have been very good and give an annual donation. WIB receive regular donations from W.H. Squires, the Funeral Directors, and local businesses have also donated. Chapple Corner needed a facelift and John wrote to local businesses asking them to sponsor providing hydrangea bushes - £300 was raised, the plants purchased, the ground was dug and prepared, and the hydrangeas planted. The high viz tabards worn by the WIB volunteers have been donated by a villager. A lot of help has been received by people throughout the village.

The September talk was an interesting one about RHS Rosemoor Garden through the seasons by the curator Jonathan Webster, who has been working at Rosemoor for 20 years. The talk was well illustrated with some drone photos showing the gardens from a perspective usually reserved for the birds!

The Garden has been in the care of the RHS for some 35 years and during that time there have been numerous changes and additions, but the bones were laid out by Lady Anne Berry who kept good records of the plants she acquired, some of which are rare in this country. Lady Anne gifted the estate to the RHS and became a gardening enthusiast after meeting Collingwood "Cherry" Ingram whilst in Spain.

We saw two wonderful trees, an oak and a flowering cherry, both of which have fallen victim to recent storms. Jonathan is a fan of liquid-amber trees and has recently had several planted, much to the dismay of the team who now have to mow in circles around them - harder work and slower than the previous straight lines!

Parish council report Autumn 2025

It is with great sadness that I begin this quarterly report as I have to speak about the escalating level of mindless intimidating vandalism that is occurring now in our village. We have had representation from concerned parishioners who have taken time to photograph these children where this vandalism is taking place. It has been centred around the Parish Hall but has moved out to the village square and the church. The church which has recently had CCTV installed photographed children climbing both through the Altar and pulpit, attempting to get into the back of the organ, break into the donation safe and use the donation hub for their gain. To add insult to injury they took the biscuits from the refreshment box for visitors and trod them into the carpet. Unfortunately the church council have had to agree to temporarily close the building unless a service or other function is taking place. Arrangements will be made for library book exchange.

The Parish Hall is losing income as classes are cancelled because of intimidation by children who when confronted are using foul language and "mooning." Several ladies have expressed their concerns and are worried about visiting village events in the dark evenings. The Parish Hall are installing CCTV once the current refurbishment is finalised.

In the Square both the Hairdressers and the toilet doors have suffered forcing, and children have been attempting to climb onto the newly refurbished slate roof by using the shop waste bins. This was all photographed by a resident of the square.

At our council meeting all the above was discussed. It was decided firstly that a dossier has to be built up of all these occurrences and reported to the police and also to our council police advocate, his email is:- stevengcsmith@aol.com. So please if you have evidence of vandalism report it to both. Secondly we are attempting to get guidance from the police as to the procedure of handling this "epidemic" and asking the appropriate officer to attend an open meeting where all of these current offences can be discussed and to seek advice on the best to move forward. Any meeting we can

arrange will be advertised.

An update on my Summer report;

The District council parcel of land suggested to become a new community space for the village has been offered to us for rent or a possible purchase. Mr Jones will seek costings of both options and these will be discussed at the November meeting. It was brought to my attention that I inadvertently made a mistake in suggesting that Mr Jones identified this piece of land, however it was a resident and I apologise to him.

I will finish with good news. The Parish clock is now functioning correctly chiming both the quarter and the hour and keeping time. One of the set of railings at "the Bow" have been removed by highways allowing access for mobility vehicles to the parish hall. No date has been identified for the light shields on the Zebra crossing but Mr. Hopely the county councillor is aware that with Winter approaching it is a priority to alleviate the light pollution for the long suffering residents of neighbouring properties.

The bridge to South Molton is finally open albeit only one lane but saving a long detour.

The council will continue to fund the village Christmas tree this year. Both myself and Cllr Northam will pick out the finest specimen in the wood to be delivered to the Square, erected and dressed by Friday 5th December.

WITHERIDGE ASTRONOMICAL SOCIETY

The darker evenings are here, and it is now time to go outside to view the jewels in the sky. On a clear night the Milky Way spreads out before you as a blanket in the heavens. Through binoculars the blanket turns out to be countless pinpoints of light as thousands and thousands of stars fill your sight. They are all stars in our own galaxy, the Milky Way. These neighbours of ours comprise many different types of star and number in the millions. Yet, there in the midst of this blanket of stars, lies a faint smudge. That is the Andromeda Galaxy, M31, our nearest large galaxy to us. It is the furthest object that we can see with the naked eye.

Mentioned before, the Pleiades are always worth a few moments to look at. Hot, blue stars surrounded by nebulosity these stars are crashing their way through a gigantic interstellar dust cloud easily seen in binoculars.

Special to November the bright star to the left of the Moon is Saturn (on the 1st) and on its right on the 2nd. The 5th November sees the biggest and brightest supermoon. Lying just 356,980 km from Earth, it is about 14% larger and 30% more brilliant than the faintest Full Moon. If it is clear, on the 6th November, in the early evening, the Pleiades can be found just to the right of the Moon. With aid Uranus can be seen to its lower right. Then on the 17/18th November there is the Leonid meteor shower which should be great to see in a moonless sky. This shower is from the remnants of Comet Tempel-Tuttle.

In December we have another meteor shower, the Geminid's will grace our skies on the 13/14th December, debris from the asteroid Phaethon. A great time to have a party with everyone holding a drink (to keep you warm) sat in a chair and facing a different direction. Every time someone sees a meteor they shout 'meteor' and someone records (time and direction – but do it quietly as the night progresses!). At the end of the party a good record of visible meteors will be available to you.

January and the discussions about the nature of the Christmas Star are past. On the night of the 3rd./4th there is the Quadrantid meteor shower. In the beginning of the month Mercury is visible in the morning whilst at the end of the month it will be seen in the evening. Caution here – do not look directly at the Sun as tour your eyesight will be damaged. Have someone with you as you view Mercury to keep you safe from accidentally seeing the Sun. Jupiter and Saturn will make for good viewing later in the month.

The Witheridge Astronomical Society meets monthly at 7.30pm on the third Thursday in the Committee Room of Witheridge Parish Hall. We are not a 'highbrow' society, our aim being to introduce people to the hobby/ science/ wonders of the night sky. If you have an interest do come along and join us. No experience or knowledge is needed. We have kindly been given some telescopes which are available to borrow.

District Councillor Update October 2025

Please see my latest update as your District councillor.

Affordable & Social Housing at Benson Grange

More affordable and social rent homes at Benson Grange have now been released, with most going to people with a local connection. If you've previously been unsuccessful, please try again; in many cases, there are now more homes than applicants.

A local priority agreement gives Witheridge residents first access before properties are offered to neighbouring parishes and then the wider North Devon area. Please check your application details carefully, as errors can lead to missed opportunities.

In addition, part ownership houses are now also on the market.

There has been a rumour that homes at Butts Close are being allocated to asylum seekers. This is not true. The local priority agreement only applies to the new homes at Benson Grange. If a resident from Butts Close moves into a new, larger home to better meet their needs, their former property is re-let through the Devon-wide system, but these homes are not, and will not be, used to house asylum seekers.

Community Grants

A fund of £15,500 was set up by L&G, the new owners of the Benson Grange development, to support local community grants. The application period is now closed, and funds are being allocated to several local organisations, including Rest A While, the Parish Hall for installation of CCTV, a project to install an additional defibrillator outside the medical centre, the Witheridge Warriors, the Sports Club, St John's Fair, and other valuable community initiatives.

This fund is in addition to the £15,500 previously awarded to local groups at the end of last year by Allison Homes.

Land Adjacent to Willow Rise

Following the purchase of the Cannington Road land by an unknown member of the public, resulting in the halting of plans for the community orchard on that site, I have been looking at the opportunity to rent or buy adjoining land next to the new park at Willow Rise from the District Council. This idea was proposed by a member of the community at a recent Parish Council meeting. This land may be available to the community for future use.

The Parish Council will be discussing options and if viable will be organising a public consultation to explore the best way forward for this use

Update on Anti-Social Behaviour and Village Concerns

There is growing concern in the village as the situation has escalated significantly in recent weeks. What began as minor incidents has now developed into widespread anti-social behaviour, with reports of vandalism, home break-ins, and increasing fear among residents, particularly the elderly and vulnerable, who are now afraid to go out, especially after dark.

Steven Smith, Police Advocate, is working hard to ensure the police are fully aware of the situation. I've also liaised with the Police and housing provider to raise these concerns. If anyone wishes to report an issue, they can contact Steven. He is able to take forward reports anonymously at stevengcsmith@aol.com or please contact the police directly.

Local Government Reform

In September, I attended a special Full Council meeting to discuss the Government's proposals for merging the districts of Devon as part of the wider programme of local government reform.

My group, the North Devon Independent Group, once again strongly advocated for the development of a Northern Devon Option as an alternative to the "1:4:5" model currently being promoted by other districts. We believe this alternative would better protect and reflect North Devon's unique identity, priorities, and needs. (Continued on next page)

Meanwhile, Devon County Council continues to push for the creation of a much larger unitary authority with its focus centred around Exeter. We remain concerned that such a model would risk marginalising more rural and coastal communities, including those in North Devon.

The final proposed direction will be presented by the district and county council in November.

Section 106 Community Projects

Projects funded by the Section 106 community fund are now underway. Money has been allocated for improvements to the Village Hall, focusing on enhancing insulation to make the building more energy-efficient and comfortable. This project has already started and will help preserve and improve the facility for years to come.

In addition, projects are being worked on for improvements to the sports field facilities led by a dedicated working group, the Parish Hall team investigating the feasibility of creating a state-of-the-art skatepark, and refurbishment and enhancement of the existing pump trail.

Further updates will be provided as these projects develop.

I have been busy supporting communities and individuals with challenges they are facing regarding planning applications. If you need advice or assistance with your own application or have concerns about a neighbouring application, please do reach out.

Planning applications received after agenda publication will be dealt with owing to a 21 day limit on the council responding to consultations from the Planning Authority. The parish council is only a consultee, and does not determine applications.

Residents can make representations in writing to the clerk or in person during the public session held at the start of a meeting. Please note in accordance with Council Standing Order 3(h) a question shall not give rise to a debate or require an immediate response


